AMPHITHEATER & CHAPEL PROJECTS

will create ample seating and audio to enhance outdoor programs for campers. The project will also increase the capacity of the seating so the entire camp can enjoy campfires, skits, songs, and presentations.

LEADER'S LODGE is a silent witness to our heritage. It remains one of the central points of camp providing a headquarters for check-ins and registration, and also a training hub for programs.

SHOOTING RANGES need a major berm renovation and better equipment for use by the thousands of Scouts who visit our camp each year.



LAKE HERMANN RESTORATION is necessary to enhance our water-front programs such as fishing and canoeing for generations to come. Restoration needs include building a new retaining wall and removal of invasive plant species.

STAFF CABIN ENHANCEMENTS have already begun thanks to generous donations and volunteers. The cabins can now house up to 12 persons and include a kitchenette, bathroom, A/C and heat, and an outdoor gathering area. We have one more cabin to repair.

SITE PRESERVATION is necessary for future generations. Presently, camp's nearly 400 acres can accommodate 1,000 Scouters, but sites flood during heavy rains. We need fill dirt, crushed concrete, and machinery to fix our roads and raise our campsites.



OUR PATH FORWARD: CAMP KARANKAWA IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Camp Karankawa is home to more than 4,000 Scouts and they need a safe, natural habitat where they can grow into tomorrow's leaders today. We need community partners like you to help us build and maintain it.
