Come to camp as a unit or come for the day. There will be camping Friday and Saturday Night with a camp fire on Saturday. Make sure to register ahead to secure a spot for camping. Earn hours towards your World Conservation Patch or log in some hours towards your Camp Karankawa Camp Ranger Conservation Patch.

There will be plenty to do for all ages of Scouts (trimming, cutting, hauling and burning). We are in need of ADULTS with riding mowers or maybe even bush hogs. (The bush hogs would be used on Friday during the day before any of the kids arrive.)

Here is a partial list of projects to be worked on:

- (1) Finding the water leak at Cub Frontier and fixing it so we can have water again.
- (2) Clear the fallen trees on the obstacle course and in the camp sites.
- (3) Refurbish the obstacles course to meet the rank requirements for Cub Scouts and make it more useful
- (4) Major Objective: To revitalize the Fort so it can be camped in and/or used.

Bring your gloves, rakes, saws, safety glasses, hard hats for falling debris areas.

Wear pants and long sleeve shirts.
